### **VALE ANTONIO LO LACONO**

It has been a little while now, around 12 weeks or so when the Football Community lost one of its own. I'm sure many of you have spoken about the incident that took Antonio's life as it was widely covered in the media at the time.

Antonio played football from under 6's right through to under 16.5's when he was diagnosed with high pressure on the optic nerves and was subjected to around 9 Lumbar Punctures to relieve the pressure on his brain etc. It was discovered that the many concussions that he attained during his playing career was the cause. During his time in footy he played alongside long-time friend Justen Kern who also wanted to give footy away at much that same period due to the bodies getting much heavier and more solid. It was suggested that both boys who loved the game so much changed their paths and take up umpiring which would see them both be able to continue in the game but not be subjected to body clash injuries.

Both Antonio and Justen were enrolled to do the basic umpires course at Football Park and soon after were performing in many games per weekend within the SANFL Juniors system.

Antonio progressed rather quickly and his name was forwarded from the Para Hills Panel to Garry Wyld at the Academy and from there in his first year was selected to officiate the Under 15 Championships Grand Final, now that's no mean feat I might add.

After that Grand Final Antonio struggled emotionally to be involved with the game if he couldn't actually play himself so he chose to walk away which was very much to the disappointment of Garry, as we knew he was held in high regard and probably could've made it to AFL level within the fraternity.

Antonio moved to the country for work and after a couple of years away from the game he started getting involved with Waikerie FC through friendships and it was inevitable he couldn't stay away from playing and as such played a full season for the Magpies without any major incident. He eventually moved back to the city and still wanted to continue playing so he chose to move to Birdwood FC alongside many others he'd played with during his junior years in the game.

Sadly, in Birdwood's first "A grade" game for points which was held at Gumeracha Oval Antonio's head clashed with an opposition player and from that he never recovered. He passed on the oval doing what he always loved doing......playing footy.

Over 1000 people attended his Funeral at Harrison's Ridgehaven home.

The photo that I have chosen to show was one I took during the Power Point presentation and has both Antonio and Justen together at their Year 12 Graduation. Antonio was Justen's Best Friend and he continues to struggle with Antonio's passing to this day.

So much of the South Australian football world loved him and he's such a great loss to all of us who knew him.

There are probably many teams up there that need a great umpire, well they're in good hands now.




