### CRAIG'S Q & A

This edition's interview is with one of nature's gentleman Mr Robert Grieve now of Beachport SA. It's a 4-hour drive and has only one pub! It does however have one of the best beaches in SA, spectacular views, great surfing, swimming, and fishing. About 800 people live in Beachport SA and one of them is Bob. I asked Bob, what took you to Beachport in retirement and what keeps you busy?

Marg and I purchased a block in Beautiful Beachport in 2001. We had a home built and moved in, from Yorke's Peninsula, in 2003. We have loved our retirement here and have become quite involved in our small community. Marg joined the SA Ambulance Brigade as a First responder 'Ambo', is a Book Club member and contributor to our local town newsletter. She and I are both involved with Meals on Wheels and with the Beachport Development Assoc, whilst I am involved with the local Lions Club (incl. terms as President, Secretary and Treasurer etc.) and the CFS. I have been fortunate to have several of my sculptures on display in town, a pastime which, together with woodworking, takes up most of my spare time. We are much closer to our two daughters, one in Millicent and the other in Melbourne and are consequently able to see much more of them and our five Grandchildren.

The SANFLUA Life Members don't see enough of you. I hear you are making a rare appearance at the 75th dinner in a few weeks?

Yes, I'm most looking forward to the SANFLUA dinner, where I hope to catch up with many old umpiring mates, many of whom I have not seen for many years!

When was your first dinner and what was your football journey? I seem to remember you looked pretty sharp in a Peter Shearer bow tie.

I commenced umpiring with the SANFL in 1972 (at the tender age of 31!) after moving to Adelaide from our hometown of Naracoorte, to take up employment with Lucy Engravers in Halifax St, where I advanced to the position of Sales Manager.

Umpiring was done with only one field umpire in those days and was consequently both physically demanding and limited in advancement opportunities. Fred Bear was the senior Coach, Bill Neill Fitness coach and Maurie Smith Country umpires' coach. Murray Ducker then took over, assisted by Mark Poser and Maurie Smith. I guess it was Mark who had the biggest influence on my career. Fitness was then under the very astute and regimented Erne Holder, a former running coach who also had a great influence on my later coaching aspiration.

The SANFL panel comprised, not only those umpiring League, seconds and colts, but most of country SA (as well as Broken Hill). Therefore, we had a very large panel, who trained in the West parklands next to Adelaide High School, the majority of whom were members of a vibrant SANFLUA.

I was fortunate enough to be voted on to the committee, where I spent terms as President and Secretary. I also produced, by means of typewriter cut stencils and a Gestetner ink hand printing machine, what was then known as "Balls UP" – the fore runner to today's magnificent publication!

I served on the Committee with Mostyn Rutter, Kevin Tannerbring, Brian Litchfield, Peter Brownrigg, Murray Bampton, Ken Potts, Laurie Argent, Adrian Forster, Des Foster, Vin Camporeale, Ric Charlesworth, Dennis Rebbeck, to name but a few.

Many big functions were organized by the enthusiastic committee, often with several hundred attending the Grand Final night function. I also recall memorable annual alternate year trips to Melbourne to be entertained by our Victorian counterparts, and then entertaining them in Adelaide.

I recall you coached for about 10 years towards the end of your running years both at SAFA, CDFA, and then as an observer with SANFLUA. We learn from our coaches. Whose philosophies and styles made the most impression on you – in your coaching role?

The year SAFA commenced (with great fanfare and the 'game of the round' played on Adelaide oval on a Sunday each week and televised live!) I left the SANFL and commenced to umpire in this new league, which was coached by Peter Clee, a former SA Amateur League Umpire. He was assisted by former SANFL League boundary umpire Stewie Loch as fitness coach. What a running machine he was!! This panel proved a great feeder for the SANFL. Names such as Schramm, Bowels, Marta, Ardill, Cresp and others all went on to 'the League'.

I was then offered the opportunity to begin my coaching career with the Central District Football Assoc, umpires panel – a daunting task for a beginner as I had 130 or so appointments to fill each week, ranging from under 11's to "A" grade! After 2 successful years and introducing the 'two umpire' system, I was then lured back to SAFA as senior coach, a challenging but very rewarding job.

I was then given the opportunity to take on the part time role of Umpiring Development Officer with SANFL, a job I shared with Frank McHugh. When the League decided to make this position full time I was fortunate enough to be taken on. This position required travel to the country panels to train and develop their own umpires. Three level accreditation was to be introduced, and the state divided into 5 areas, each under the control of an Umpire Manager. These had to be selected and trained accordingly.

Similarly, city panels were monitored and my role also involved observing, recruiting and training potential future SANFL umpires. I was fortunate to work closely with Des Foster who became a full- time umpire director with the League, Frank McHugh, Mark Mackie, Mostyn Rutter and subsequently Shane Harris when he became umpire director. Probably the high point of my time in this position was the establishment of the Umpiring Academy, which we based at Pultney Grammar School.

#### Who do you catch up with these days Bob?

Over the many years spent in the umpiring community I have made many good friends. In the days of SAFA a few of us started to play cards on an end-of-season trip and to this day some of still get together regularly. Stewie Loch, Geoff Bowels, 'Serious' Schramm, John Hutchinson, Ally McCallum, 'Jocko' Lyons and I play several times a year...with the Adelaide boys managing a trip to Beachport occasionally! Sadly, the youngest of our group, Dominic Marta, is no longer with us.

I'm most thankful to have had such a great time umpiring.... It kept a raw country lad sane when he went to live in the 'big smoke'! Getting out into the country on a weekend was great, as was travelling to all parts of the state with some real characters, whose memories will stay with me forever. It was hard on my ever-loving wife and two daughters to be left at home, although they were able to accompany on some occasions to enjoy the country hospitality. I'm forever grateful to Marg and my two lovely daughters for allowing me the opportunity to experience the umpiring career I've had.

Thanks, Bob, for the wonderful trip down memory lane. You didn't mention the great pasties at Kadina for our readers but to all Life Members, if you want to hear more from Bob, book a table at the Beachport Pub and invite him to lunch OR make sure you attend this years dinner and pull up a chair on his table. The clock is ticking for us all but don't worry about avoiding temptation. As you grow older, it will avoid you. Thank you again Bob Grieve.



In the first weekend of the Finals, we congratulate Sam Royans on the triple-treat of milestones from Sunday at Adelaide Oval. It was Sam's 40th League Final, his 50th Final across all grades, AND it was also his 400th SANFL match overall. Sam started Umpiring with SANFL in 2006, quickly rising to be a Reserves regular in 2007 and 2008 on the Senior Panel, debuting in League in 2007, and becoming a regular at the top level from 2009. Sam's first final was back in 2006, in the Under 17 2nd Semi Final, running that day with Ben Sieben and Bryce Watkins. His first League final was in 2009, 2nd Semi at Football Park, Centrals vs. Glenelg. To hit 40 League finals is a massive feat and a testament to Sam's love of Umpiring and resilience in his 18th season of SANFL Football.
