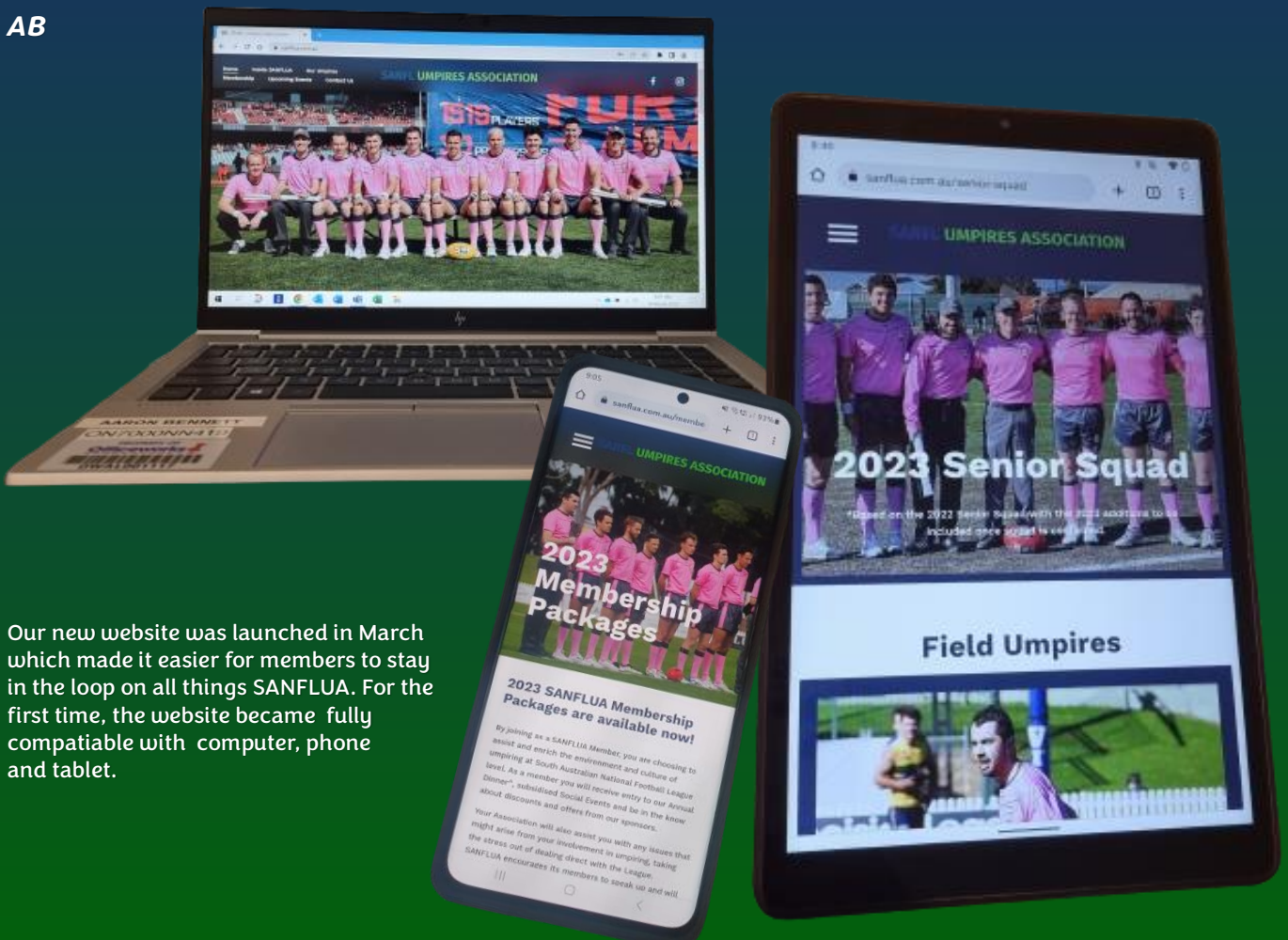

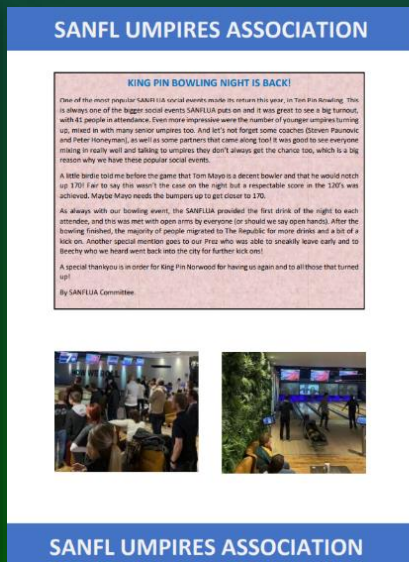
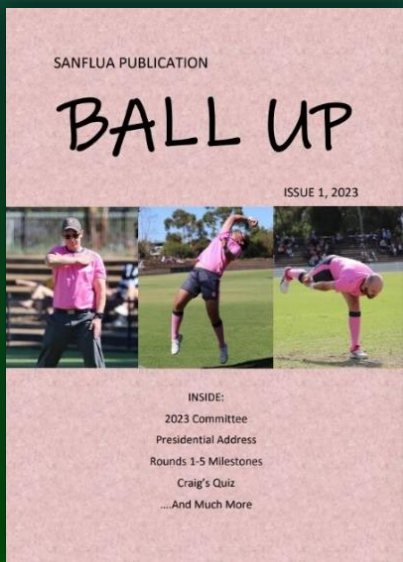

Treasurer's Report

2023 was an exciting year for the Association celebrating the 75th Annual Dinner, which was held with memorabilia through the decades and one of the largest attendances to the Annual Dinner in the Association's history.

There was a change in Annual Dinner venue for 2023 due to the celebrations, with the event being held at the National Wine Centre. As a result of this change in venue and increase in attendance, there were increased costs for the Annual Dinner.

A deficit for the year of \$2,687 was incurred 2023 surplus \$3,687. The main reason for the deficit for 2023 was the increase in Annual Dinner costs and also due to there being no increase in the Full Membership fee for season 2023.

With the success of the Annual Dinner for 2023, it was also pleasing to see an increase in membership numbers and incoming membership fees for 2023. This increase was assisted by members being able to have their membership fees deducted directly from match payments.

The cost of the Annual Dinner is the largest cost to the Association being \$20,221 for the 2023 Annual Dinner compared to \$11,964 in the previous year. The increase in costs was driven by two factors; the change in venue and also the increase in attendance numbers for 2023.

The location of the Annual Dinner for 2024 will be reviewed by the committee.

With the deficit for the year, the cash account with People's Choice Credit Union also has a balance of \$ 5,633 (2022 : \$8,682) and term deposit with Bendigo & Adelaide Bank \$16,441 (2022 : \$16,079). This gave rise to net assets of SANFLUA \$22,074 as at 31 October 2023.

At the AGM, the Association will review the membership fee charges and categories for the 2024 season to ensure value for money continues to be provided to members.

I would also like to thank the Committee for their hard work over the 2023 season and the challenges that continued to be faced throughout the football community, due to the impacts of COVID and the ever changing environment this brings.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 OCTOBER 2023**NOTE 1: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES****Basis of Preparation**

The financial statements are special purpose financial statements prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act 1985.

The Committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial statements, except for the cash flow information, have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs. The amounts presented in the financial statements have been rounded to the nearest dollar.

Accounting Policies**a. Income Tax**

The association is exempt from income tax pursuant to section 50-45 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

b. Cash on Hand

Cash on hand includes cash on hand, deposits held at-call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

c. Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. Any consideration deferred is treated as the provision of finance and is discounted at a rate of interest that is generally accepted in the market for similar arrangements. The difference between the amount initially recognised and the amount ultimately received is interest revenue.

Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised at the point of delivery as this corresponds to the transfer of significant risks and rewards of ownership of the goods and the cessation of all involvement by the company in those goods.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest method, which, for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument.

Revenue recognition relating to the provision of services is determined with reference to the stage of completion of the transaction at the end of the reporting period and where outcome of the contract can be estimated reliably. Stage of completion is determined with reference to the services performed to date as a percentage of total anticipated services to be performed. Where the outcome cannot be estimated reliably, revenue is recognised only to the extent that related expenditure is recoverable.

d. Comparative Figures

When required by Accounting Standards, comparative figures have been adjusted to conform to changes in presentation for the current financial year.

Where the association retrospectively applies an accounting policy, makes a retrospective restatement or reclassifies items in its financial statements, a third statement of financial position as at the beginning of the preceding period is presented in addition to the minimum comparative financial statements.
